Greetings from snowy Friendswood, TX.

That's right as we write this letter, it's currently snowing outside, with light accumulation! This is reflective of the year it's been, no truly big news to report, but plenty of interesting tidbits. (At least we hope they're interesting; otherwise we apologize in advance for boring you) We spent the first half of the years visiting local sights, and then the second half wandering around the country and chewing up vacation time and digital film like crazy.
