Greetings from Friendswood, TX

Hard to believe it's been another year. It's been a year of ups and downs, but we're still here making the best of it.

So covering the downs first, we lost both Basil and Joules this year. Basil in March due to renal failure and Joules in September due to cancer. They were both good cats and we're sad that they're gone, but we know they both had long and happy lives. Julie's father passed away this year, and we attended his memorial service and funeral in Arlington Virginia this December.

In brighter news Megan has a couple new cousins: Maggie and Trevor. Maggie was born to Winston's brother Billie and sister-in-law April, and Trevor to Winston's sister Peggy and brother-in-law Brady. 




